10. What did these people need to hear? Did it make any difference if they listened or not? (3:4-3:11)
11. What happened to the sweetness of the words he had taken in? (3:12-14)
12. Do you sense a rebuke from God to Ezekiel? What seems to be his shortcoming here? (3:22-27)
13. Do you find these words personally convicting? What is God telling Ezekiel his responsibility is toward those living in sin? (3:22-27)
