5. In Ezekiel 22 there are three illustrations of Jerusalem's uncleanness. Explain the intent of each one.
 - ❑ The bloody city (Ezekiel 22:1-16)
 - ❑ The dross of silver (Ezekiel 22:17-22)
 - ❑ An unwashed land (Ezekiel 22:23-31)
6. What is the point of the allegory concerning Oholah and Oholibah? (Ezekiel 23:1-49)
7. What was the significance of the date upon which this oracle was given? Why should this have impressed those who received it? (Ezekiel 24:24)
8. How does the death of Ezekiel's wife illustrate the situation among God's people?
9. Explain how Ezekiel would find out about the fall of Jerusalem. What change would this bring to him?
