

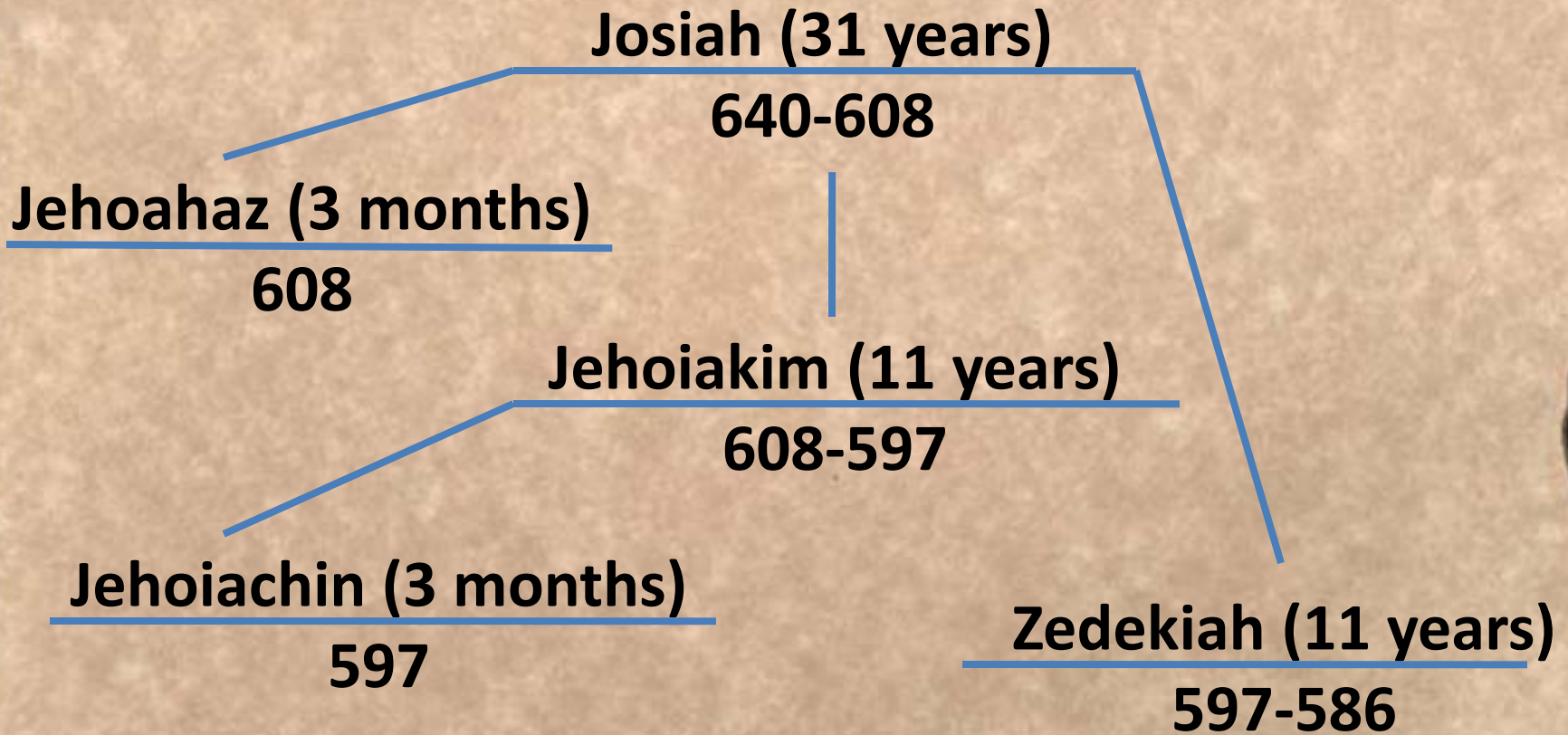

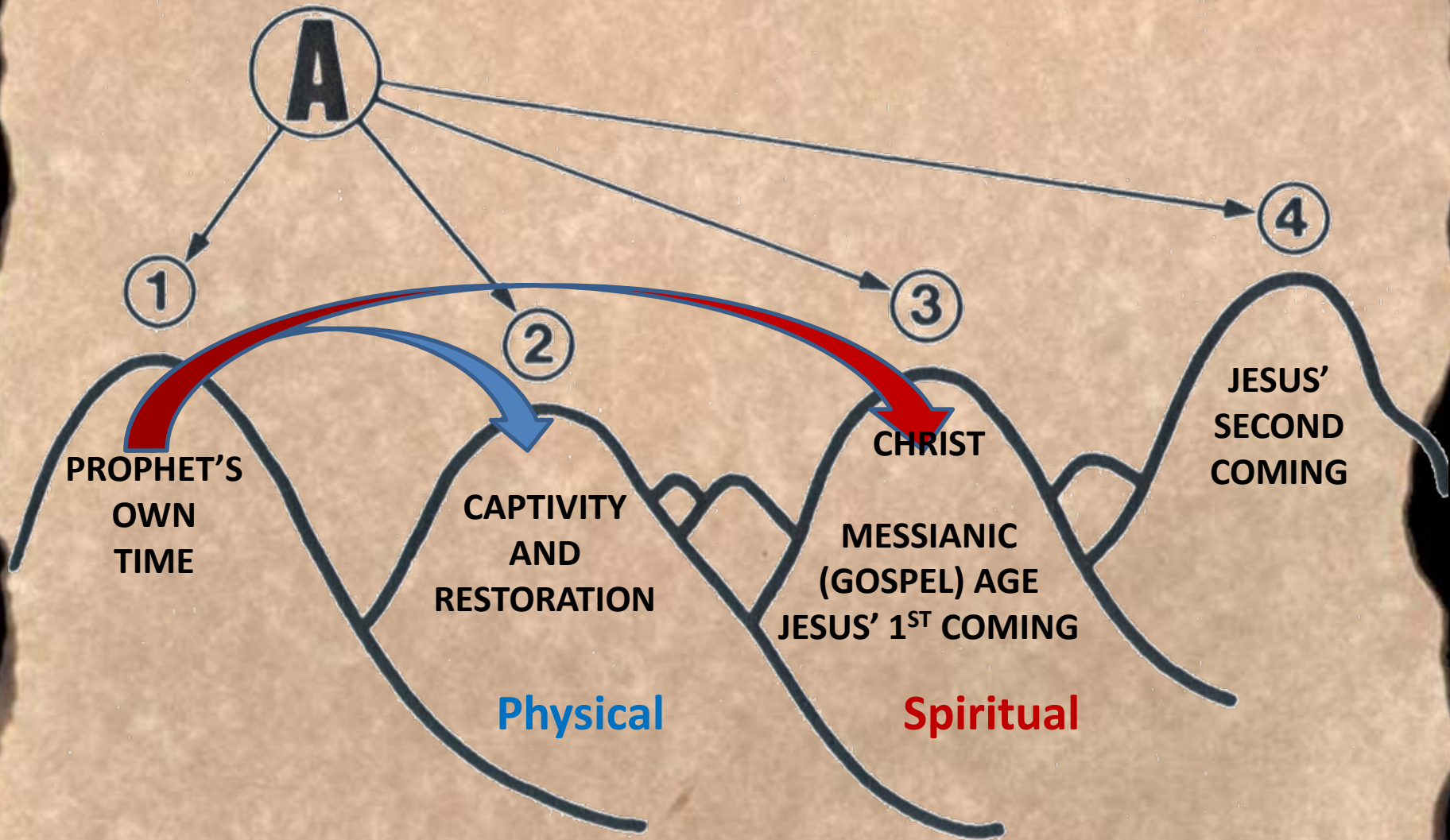
The Last Kings of Judah

(2 Kings 21-25; 2 Chronicles 33-36)



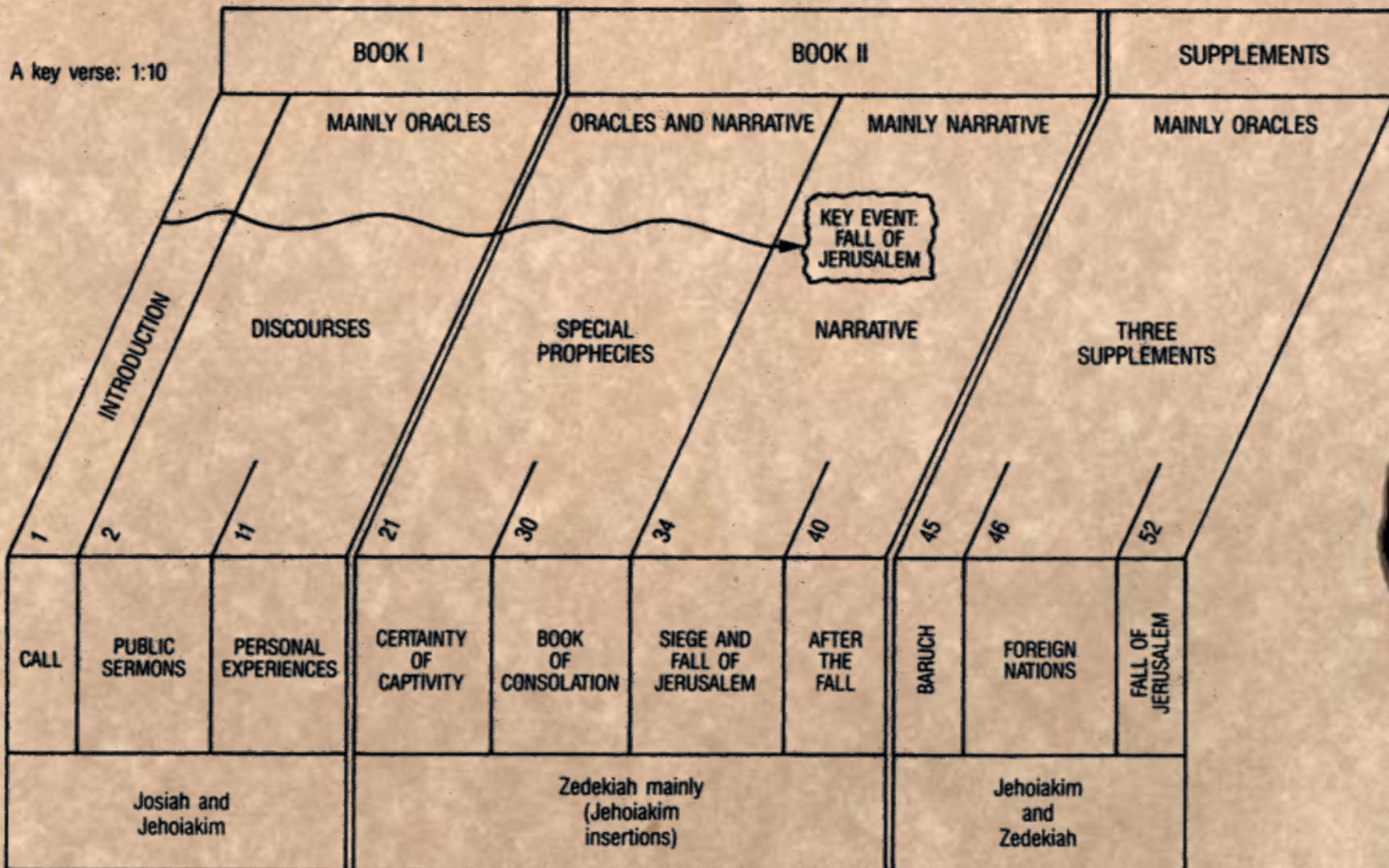

Jeremiah 1

- Call of Jeremiah
- Two visions
 - The rod of the almond tree
 - The boiling pot
- Charge to Jeremiah – Get ready to work!

Ten Messages of Judgment

(Jeremiah 2-25)

1. Israel is accused of breaking the covenant by forsaking God and trusting in idols 2:1–3:5
2. Judah will be judged due to its rejection of Yahweh and its refusal to repent: 3:6–6:30
3. Ritual will not save Judah, only Yahweh can save her; man's foolishness leads to judgment 7:1–10:25
4. Rebellion against Yahweh leads to judgment, but God will restore His people and the nations will praise Yahweh 11:1–12:17

Ten Messages of Judgment

(continued)

5. Jeremiah gives five warnings to Judah of judgment due to pride which reveal Israel's idolatrous character: 13:1-27
6. Judgment will come because of self-trust instead of faith in Yahweh, and God is asked to remember the covenant 14:1–17:27
7. Since God is sovereign, the nation is to submit to His way— judgment is coming 18:1–20:18
8. Jeremiah emphasizes that the city is going to be judged by God and there is no way out, so to be in God's will, they must leave the land 21:1-14

Ten Messages of Judgment

(continued)

9. Jeremiah affirms that the wicked leaders (kings, lying prophets) are leading the people astray, but that the good shepherd gathers the people resulting in the principle that obedience leads to blessing, but disobedience leads to cursing 22:1–24:10
10. Judgment is certain from Judah to the whole world because there is a refusal to heed the word of God 25:1-38
